

56 MSW & C&D tonnage of 1,978 was 79 tons less than March 2025, and YTD2026's 5,140 tons
57 were 134 tons less than YTD2025. The total of 3,366 transactions in March 2026 was 46 less than
58 March 2025, and YTD2026's 8,056 transactions were 544 less than YTD2025. In March 2026, 20
59 tons of tires were hauled, and YTD2026's 61 tons were 15 tons less than YTD2025. In March
60 2026, 7.72 tons of food waste were hauled to CSWD's Green Mt. Compost, and YTD2026's 15.69
61 tons hauled were 1.10 tons less than YTD2025. DP mentioned that this year's audit is still in
62 process and we are hoping to have draft 2025 financial statements by the end of this month to
63 present to the BOS in June. DP also presented data from the District's Regional Residential Drop-
64 Off in New Haven from October 2025 to March 2026. DG suggested using signage at the
65 intersection of Route 7 and Campground Road or on the attendant shed to gain more visibility.
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67 **b. March 2026 Single Stream Recycling Report** – DP reported that the March 2026 single stream
68 recyclables total of 294 tons received was 26 tons less than March 2025, and YTD2026's 922 tons
69 were 70 tons less than YTD2025. In March 2026, the Transfer Station delivered 290 tons of single
70 stream recyclables to the Chittenden Solid Waste District (CSWD) Materials Recycling Facility
71 (MRF) in Williston. Costs for hauling and recycling were \$35,096, with revenues of \$40,469, for a
72 pre-OH gross profit of \$5,373 for the month, and a YTD2026 pre-OH gross profit of \$16,504.
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74 **7. POLICY COMMITTEE REPORT** – The Committee is meeting again on May 22 and will continue its
75 review of the Policy Implementing the Waste Management Ordinance with the intent to provide draft
76 revisions to the Executive Board in June.

79 **b. New Haven Regional Residential Transfer Station and HHW Building Update** – The final
80 design of the HHW building is almost finished, and the wastewater and stormwater permits for the
81 HHW building are now complete. The Act 250 permit is near the end of the public comment
82 period, with only one comment received from ANR about mitigation of impacts to protected bat
83 species during site preparation and construction.

84 **c. Hazardous Waste Disposal Contract Renewal Option** – BE reported that the Tradebe and
85 Republic contracts are coming up for renewal in July. Tradebe offered a contract renewal with
86 disposal rates held the same for one year, and Republic has offered a 5% increase in disposal
87 pricing, with transport, labor, and facility fees remaining the same. He recommended renewing
88 contracts with both companies at these rates for another year.
